1. Purpose of the Study

If you decide at this point to take part, you are still free to withdraw at any time, without giving a reason. You are also free to decide not to answer any question asked or to request that certain answers are deleted. You will be given a copy of this information sheet, the debriefing sheet, and the signed consent form for your own records.
